




















Cartoon by Mirko Scewczuk (1919-1957) Originally published in *Die Zeit* February 3, 1949






Poster by S. Malewicz made in 1938 In collection Library of Congress






Copyright


- Intelectual property law that gives the creator of an intelectual work (book, photo, designs, art...) the right to control how his/her work may be used
- Restrict others from using the intelectual work of other
- Often territorial rights
- Many different copyright laws wordwide
- Can be expensive depending on use
- Important rule: 70 years afterd dead of creator a work is in the public domain and can be freely used
- Copyright laws were not designed for our present day internet society!
- Changes are coming:
 - Creative commons licences






Historical material

- Problems with photos found on the internet
- Creator not always traceable
 - You should be able to prove that you tried to find copyright holder
- Copyright situation not always clear (collective arrangements Pictoright)
- Problems for online picture archives



- 0.3 A view of the construction of the Petrin tower, 1891.










Prevent problems
